## Another Reason to Get a Flu Shot: Cardiovascular Events

Nearly 12% of adults hospitalized for influenza suffer an acute cardiovascular event, almost one-third of these patients are admitted to the intensive-care unit (ICU), and 7% of those admitted to the ICU die during hospitalization, according to an August 25, 2020, study in the *Annals of Internal Medicine*.
